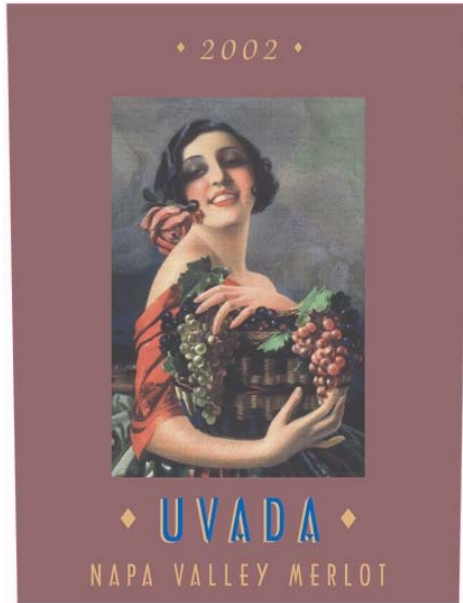


Uvada Merlot, Napa Valley 2002



Uvada, in the Spanish language, means "a bountiful harvest," and this wine indeed offers bountiful fruit flavors, rich textures, and a softly persistent finish.

A vintage advertising poster inspired Uvada's elegant label and the wine itself mirrors an Old World style of balance and harmony.

The 2002 vintage Uvada Napa is a blend of Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon from two of the finest vineyards in Napa Valley's Oakville appellation.

Winemaker John McKay's Note:

"The 2002 vintage Uvada Napa Valley Merlot is a blend of 85% Merlot and 15% Cabernet Sauvignon from the Oakville District in Napa Valley. This vintage is consistent with the previous two in that it shows ripe and fruity aromas of red currants, milk chocolate, and toasty French oak. The rich flavors, mature tannins, and lingering finish make this a wine worthy of its namesake."
